It is operated by the Academic Council for Emergency and Trauma and was started in 2008. It is a unique accomplishment for India's First Internationally circulated Journal to achieve Indexing within 4 issues of its release.

PubMed includes links to full text articles and other related resources."

JETS are indexed with PubMed back from the First Issue in 2008. MEDICAL COUNCIL OF INDIA

AMENDMENT NOTIFICATION
New Delhi, the 21st July, 2009

MCI.18(1)/2009- Med. / 22653 - In exercise of the powers conferred by Section 33 of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 (102 of 1956), the Medical Council of India with the previous approval of the Central Government hereby makes the following regulations to further amend the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000", namely:-

- i) These Regulations may be called the "Postgraduate Medical Education (Amendment) Regulations, 2009 Part-II"
 - ii They shall come into force on the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.
2. In the "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000" the following additions / modifications/deletions/substitutions, shall be as indicated therein:-

Under the heading MD (Doctor of Medicine) the following shall be added after S.No. 29.

EMERGENCY MEDICINE

Infectious Diseases

Clause C under the heading D.M (Doctor of Medicine) prior requirement for "Cardiology" at SL. No. 1 after MD (Paediatrics) "MD (Respiratory Medicine)" Shall be added.

Clause C under the heading D.M (Doctor of Medicine) prior requirement for Gastroenterology at SL. No. 6 "MD (Paediatrics)" shall be deleted.

Clause C under the heading D.M (Doctor of Medicine) the following shall be added after Sl.No. 12:-

- 13 Pulmonary Medicine - MD (General Medicine)
 - MD (Pediatrics)
 - MD (Resp. Medicine)
- 14 Rheumatology - MD (General Medicine)
 - MD (Pediatrics)
- 15 Child & Adolescent Psychiatry - MD (Psychiatry)
- 16 Paediatrics Gastroenterology - MD (Paediatrics)
- 17 Paediatrics Cardiology MD (Paediatrics)
- 18 Cardiac Anaesthesia - MD (Anaesthesia)
- 19 Lt. Col. (Retd.) Dr. ARN Setalvad,

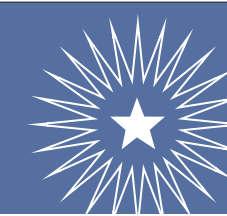
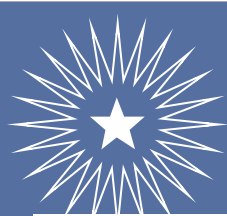

Global Experts Meet at President John F Kennedy Presidential Museum and Library Boston, Massachusetts, USA

DeValle Institute for Emergency Preparedness held its annual Conference on the 15th and 16th of June 2009 at the JFK Presidential Museum and Library in Boston. The Conference was held in collaboration with Centers for Disease Control and Prevention USA.

Dr Sanjeev Bhoi and Dr Sagar Galwankar participated in this conference. Speakers from all over the world spoke at this illustrious meeting which focused on Planning an Interdisciplinary Response to events secondary to "Terrorist Use of Explosives (TUE)".

The Discussion Sessions was uniquely conducted in way that each expert had the opportunity to highlight a particular aspect of planning. These highlighted points were later opened for discussion and there were facilitators who noted each and every point discussed.

It was decided that these points would later be formatted and used as a Framework for creating Plans

for Education, Testing and Implementation. All experts agreed that Disaster Training should be an important aspect of the education curriculum in Medicine and Allied Medicine Specialties like Laboratory, Emergency Transportation, Civil Administration and Urban Planning.
