Jefferson Award for Public Service-National Media (2007), "Gujarat Garima" the highest honor from the Chief Minister of Gujarat (2007), Ellis Island Medal of Honor for Exceptional Immigrant Patriots (2007), The Tampa Bay Hall of Fame (2010) and Ballington and Maud Booth Award (2012).

Dr. Pallavi Patel is the only Asian woman to be included in the Florida Hall of Fame (2008). The duo are also Hosts of the famous IIFA Awards 2014.

The contribution to the University of South Florida Charter School in 2003, the Dr. Kiran C. Patel Research Institute in Tampa, the Dr. Pallavi Patel Performing Arts Conservatory at the Straz Center, the Dr. Kiran C. Patel School of Global Sustainability, their foundation sponsored 50 heart surgeries for Tanzanian children at a hospital in India, built a Hospice center for HIV patients in Zambia, the foundation operates 'C.A. Patel Learning Institute' (a school with 1200 students that provides higher education opportunities to children from rural areas of Gujarat) at Patel's father's village Mota Fofalia. The Patel Center will be known for its support of distinguished research and educational programs that promote sustainable, healthy communities in a globalizing world with generous donations from the couple.

The couple and the foundation supports the initiative in the field of healthcare for a noble cause with a philanthropy and business as two sides of any endeavor in this world. INDUSEM enjoys the support of the foundation since 10 years and thankful for the same.

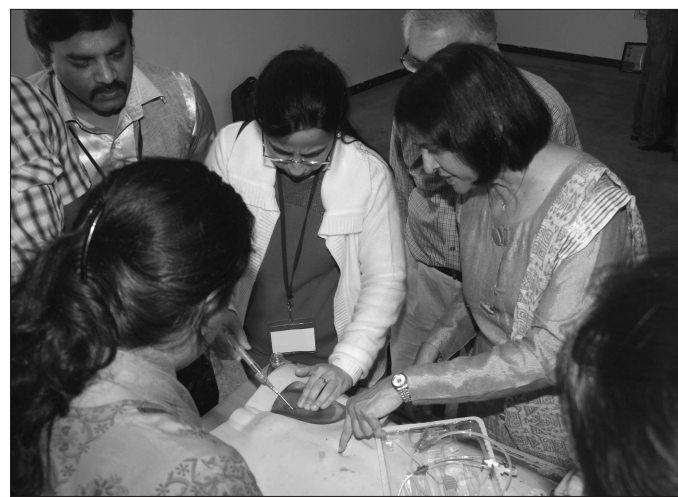

The course was comprehensive with both theoretical knowledge and practical skills covered during the 5 days. Feedback forms were collected daily from the fellows at the end, with 99% fellows giving full marks to all the sessions. Professor Praveen Aggrawal, Head, Department of Emergency Medicine, AIIMS, interacted with the fellows during the



sessions and gave useful tips. A round table meeting was held, which was also attended by Dr Dheeraj Shah, Editor in Chief, Indian Pediatrics, various strategies to promote this very important science was discussed including multicentric research projects. Dr Sudarshan Grover from Michigan also attended the course. All the participants were enthusiastic and promised to convince authorities to create Division of Pediatric Emergency Medicine at the respective departments of the medical colleges.

Twenty five fellows perusing FACEE-Pediatric Emergency Medicine fellowship attended this course. The course was a mixture of lectures and workshop on simulation and emergency ultrasonography. Interesting drills on cardiac arrhythmias, seizures and airway management were conducted on SIM BABY installed, with one to one interaction with the faculty. Fellows gained expertise in performing FAST, dynamic intubation, central line insertion, evaluating pneumonia, pleural effusion, ventricular septal defects. Four faculty members from USA and One from India conducted the course.

Guinness Record by INDUSEM Family Member

The most blood pressure readings taken in 8 hours is 8,368 and was achieved by Vadodara Municipal Corporation and Health Department during an event organised by Chief Health Officer Dr. Devesh M. Patel (all India), at the Akota stadium, Vadodara, India, This achievement was recorded in the Guinness book of World Records. The record attempt took place on World Health Day and the theme for 2013 campaign was Hypertension. The aim of the record was to raise awareness of high blood pressure and promote behavioural change with respect to primary prevention in order to improve the chances of early detection and promote effective management for patients. **The INDUSEM TEAM takes pleasure in congratulating Dr Devesh in this initiative for a common cause towards the common man.**
