World Emergency Medicine Day – 27th May

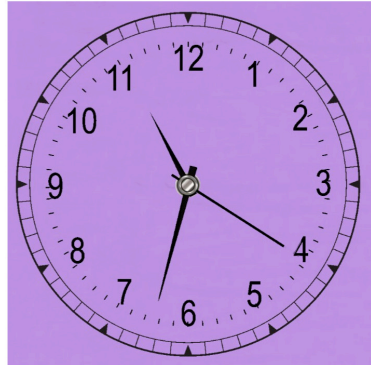
27th May is observed as World Emergency Medicine Day worldwide. The aim of this day is to unite the world population and decision makers in thinking about emergency medicine and emergency aid.

World Blood Donors Day – 14th June

Blood is the most vital component in our body. Every 2 seconds, someone somewhere needs blood. Acknowledging this, on May 2005, the 58th World Health Assembly, minister of health across the globe unanimously decided to support and encourage voluntary blood donation. Through its resolution, they designated 14th June as the World Blood Donors Day, every year.

On this day, we thank voluntary blood donors for their life saving deed of blood donation, alongside raising awareness regarding the need for regular donations, that ensure that people in need, get quality reservoir of blood and blood products. This is an integral part of universal health coverage and a key component of an effective health system.

The theme for this year's campaign is “blood

donation and universal access to safe blood transfusion”. The slogan is “Safe Blood for all”.

By donating one unit of blood, we can save up to 3 lives. Today, blood transfusions can involve specific parts of the blood instead of whole blood - Red blood cells, White blood cells, Platelets and Plasma. Body recovers the Blood very quickly: Blood plasma volume– within 24 - 48 hours, Red Blood Cells – in about 3 weeks, Platelets & White Blood Cells – within minutes.

In the emergency room, we witness the importance of blood transfusion, on a day to day basis. It's time that we all step forward, to support, to promote and to lend a helping hand for Voluntary Blood Donation.

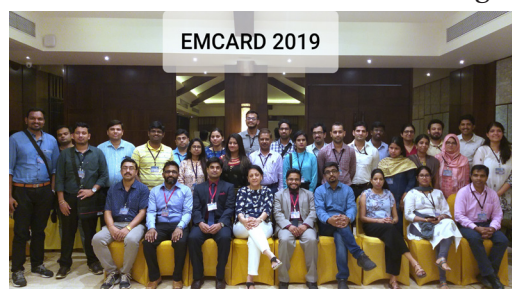
Professor Aggarwal Leads MISSION DELHI@ICMR
